

Putting people with disabilities under a positive spotlight, locally-based (and internationally operating) video production company Trending Media Australia has now partnered with Redcliffebased disability support non-profit ROPE to bring AbiliTV to air.

AbiliTV is now a regular TV show that expands on ROPE's ethos of empowering personal development through the provision of information, education and life skills training.

Co-director Aaron Lucas, who, together with co-director Jesse Ellis, created Trending Media in 2014, said the idea started when ROPE CEO Wes Bleakley engaged his company to produce marketing content.

"Given the variety and depth of ROPE programmes, we suggested to Wes that instead of just creating marketing videos, we could produce a TV show to highlight them all," Mr Lucas said.

In this way, ROPE TV was born, and after two fantastic seasons of the series, the need for something with a broader focus became apparent. hosting the show.

Mr Lucas said the show was already helping to change the perception that individuals with disabilities are less capable of living fulfilling and successful lives.

"In reality, most are perfectly capable of achieving great things; they just do it differently or think about it differently," Mr Lucas said.

He said that people often don't realise the incredible things individuals with disabilities are accomplishing.

"It's wonderful to showcase these amazing stories, but it's also important to highlight the challenges and struggles they face, so people are aware of both the triumphs and the obstacles in their lives," Mr Lucas said.

Redcliffe State High School (RSHS) has become a hotspot for fostering local sporting talent, with six different NRL clubs across Australia now having signed students onto their teams.

Through RSHS's Rugby League Excellence Program (and with a few boys also represented by sporting talent agency Caliber Sports Group), over ten boys have been signed with NRL clubs and are currently pursuing their goals.

Jay Wilkinson, Rugby League Coordinator at RSHS, said that having the boys consistently signed up to NRL clubs gave the school's program a wonderful sense of recognition and that this was backed up by dedication from all involved.

"We are always proud of what they have achieved and our focus, as a school, is on developing everyone and that includes skills as well as behaviour – that is, developing them as a person," Mr Wilkinson said.

According to Mr Wilkinson, the boys were getting good feedback from the NRL clubs and were able to extract a wealth of experience from their training. "The clubs are really good about giving them feedback in videos and they can take back things they've learned and teach their teammates at school," Mr Wilkinson said.

One of the RSHS students, Ryan White, who signed with Melbourne Storm, said this was only the start of his journey.

"The hard work doesn't stop here – if anything, being signed has made me more focused," Ryan said.

Caliber Sports Group said their goal for the students they represented was for them to achieve professional success on the field while also pursuing personal growth and contributing positively to the sport and society.

"We believe they have the potential to become influential figures who inspire the next generation of athletes," a representative from Caliber Sports Group said.

The group's spokesperson said they anticipated that these Redcliffe High School students would not only excel in their rugby league careers but also become role models in their communities.

The advice for other aspiring athletes was to understand that success in sports requires a combination of talent, hard work and perseverance.



he product of lots of local talent and skill coming together, Sandgate-based band PAGE8 have produced and distributed their first album, which was recorded in Clontarf.

The debut album, titled Leaving This Town (which is described as having a rock, contemporary and alternative sound) was recorded at Lush Recording Studios and has been released on Spotify, iTunes, and YouTube, with live radio airplay on 4ZZZ.

According to Annalisse Thiedeke, vocalist, writer and keys for PAGE8, the band was originally composed of classmates at Rockhampton High School and was reformed via a Facebook connection made during COVID lockdowns.

"This album was written during lockdowns, so Jason (guitarist and writer) would write guitar riffs and send them to me by phone and I would work on putting them together and writing lyrics," Ms Thiedeke said.

She said that she had the most amazing time making the album at Lush Recording

Studios (used by artists such as Katy Perry, Jimmy Barnes and Sarah McLeod) and this included time spent with "session musicians like Steve Francis from the Queensland Symphony Orchestra and Bobby Poulton from Wolfmother."

"Even though we started playing and writing music when we were fourteen, we never got to record those songs," Ms Thiedeke said.

"Writing this new album together felt completely natural and is definitely a reflection of our style of playing and taste in music over the years."


Ms Thiedeke said the band was extremely grateful for the support of local radio station 4ZZZ and praised the "impact they have in supporting emerging musicians in Brisbane" as well as the backdrop of Moreton Bay itself.

REDCLIFFE MUSEUM LAUNCHES INTERACTIVE SPACE

Redcliffe Museum is reaching for the stars with a free, interactive exhibition that uncovers Australia's role in space technology and exploration.

Australia in Space - Earth and Beyond, a travelling exhibition developed by Questacon - National Science and Technology Centre will be open to the public from 10 August to 3 November.

Questacon's travelling exhibitions manager, Tim Crowther, said the National Science and Technology Centre was excited to showcase the exhibition at the Redcliffe Museum.

"We hope this exhibition allows visitors to discover Australia's inspiring contributions to the space sector and the surprising ways space technologies are used in everyday life," Tim said.

Australia in Space - Earth and Beyond offers space enthusiasts the chance to pilot a simulated Mars rover and discover how Australia's expertise in remote mining could benefit future space missions. Laser-based puzzle games demonstrate the role of satellites in over-the-horizon communication, while Museum visitors will also have the opportunity to use a virtual telescope to 'link up' with iconic deep space missions.

"Questacon would like to thank the City of Moreton Bay for hosting our exhibition and look forward to playing our part inspiring the next generation towards the many opportunities and careers in Australia's growing space industry," Tim said.

Mayor Peter Flannery said the sky was no longer the limit for City of Moreton Bay with the arrival of the free, hands-on exhibition that was fun for the whole family.

"This August, we have the opportunity to experience first-hand how space exploration pushes the limits of ingenuity and technology, how Australia plays a vital role in the global space community, and how space is changing how we live, learn and work," he said.

"I guarantee you will be amazed."

The exhibition takes off with a free opening event on 10 August, with astrophysicist Professor Tamara Davis from the University of Queensland (UQ) discussing The Dark Side of the Universe. UQ's Science Troupe will also be conducting science experiments in celebration of National Science Week.

Visitors are also encouraged to explore the Beyond the Horizon Imaginarium, an interactive space offering games, activities and videos.

Redcliffe Museum is open Wednesday to Friday from 10am to 4pm and Saturday and Sunday from 10am to 3pm.

"I began strength training for my health after a major surgery I almost didn't survive," she said. "A dear friend of mine, who was a world champion powerlifter, introduced me to a strength and conditioning coach, who helped me recover and get strong.

"Through that process, my friend commented that I was lifting heavier weights

than her and should be competing. So with my team behind me, I decided to enter a novice event, which I won. I was hooked!"

After joining Powerlifting Australia at 49, Jan encountered a significant challenge – contracting long-Covid in April 2023, resulting in an almost year-long recovery.

When the National Championships came around, Jan had only five weeks notice. But with her sights set on success, Jan lifted her way through the competition, qualifying for the world championships in October.

Jan's passion for powerlifting has permeated her professional life, with her business Over 50s Health helping others improve their health through strength, nutrition and mental support.

"The beauty of powerlifting is that it involves the functional movements we make every single day, like walking up the stairs, carrying the groceries, opening doors, sitting down, getting up out of a chair and lifting something from the floor," she said.

"Let me tell you, I've been lifting heavy weights for a while now, and what it does is change my body composition, improve my bone density and give me confidence and better mental health.

"I say there's nothing better than powerlifting – you don't have to compete, but please get strong!"

owering her way to new heights, Redcliffe local and powerlifting champion Jan Roesch is going from strength to strength.

Surpassing her personal best at the recent Powerlifting Australia National Championships, Jan qualified for this year's World Powerlifting Championships.

Jan said she was elated by the results.

"When you achieve your goals as an athlete, the feeling lasts for a long time and should be bottled," she said. "With only four weeks training preparation going into the competition, I wasn't overly concerned if I didn't go for any of the records.

"However, it ended up being my best competition ever and I achieved the Australia and Oceania Total Records, as well as a gold medal for my age group and the silver medal for my weight class. World Championships here we come!"

Jan's road to the top has not been an easy one.

Raise it for Redcliffe Hospital Giving Day is an annual fundraising effort to add a touch of home to hospital facilities and this year's event will focus on the paediatric and palliative care units.

Celebrated on Thursday, 29 August this year, Giving Day is the major fundraising campaign for Raise it for Redcliffe Hospital, a partnership between the RBWH Foundation and Redcliffe Hospital.

Funds raised support patient care projects, life-changing health research and other hospital initiatives that fall outside the scope of government funding.

RBWH Foundation CEO Simone Garske said more than \$800,000 had been raised by the community since Raise it for Redcliffe Hospital was launched in 2020.

"This year, Giving Day hopes to surpass \$1 million to make even greater community impact," she said.

For the Templeman family, including patient Vicki and her son, Ben, refurbishment of the patient lounge in the rehabilitation and stroke unit, funded through Giving Day donations, was the greatest gift the Moreton Bay community could have given to people undergoing lengthy recovery.

"You can't believe the difference that it can make, somewhere like this; it just makes the world of difference," Vicki said.

"Mum loves the thought that if anyone else has to be in the rehabilitation unit for as long as she was, that they have a lovely garden to enjoy and a beautiful cafe-style lounge to spend time with family and friends during the long months of recovery," Ben said.

The power of giving will help transform another space in the parent lounge and children's playroom in the paediatric unit, and continue the palliative care unit makeover.

On the day, the event will feature community radio 99.7 Bridge FM onsite at the hospital, bake sales, a plant sale, sausage sizzle, prizes, a ping pong tournament and more.

HEADSPACE REDCLIFFE CELEBRATES A DECADE OF SUPPORT FOR YOUTH

he community is coming together to celebrate the 10th anniversary of headspace Redcliffe, a beacon of hope for those aged 12-25 needing mental health support.

The milestone will be marked by a Cheers to 10 Years birthday ceremony and an official relaunch of the renovated centre this month.

Community Development Officer Rikki Gross said headspace Redcliffe had supported 4900 young people since opening in 2014.

"There have been countless stories of the strength of young people who have accessed our service and flourished in the wider community," Rikki said.

"There have been many highlights throughout the decade, however, some have really stood out, including being the charity recipient for the Jetty2Jetty Fun Run and the inaugural Moreton Bay PrideFest charity partner.

"We have recently said farewell to a Youth Reference Group member who has advocated for youth mental health since she was 16. This is a headspace nationwide first and we feel grateful to have had such an impact. "We hope that by continuing to actively engage in the local community, at schools and events we can break down barriers of access."

The renovations include two sensory rooms with low-lighting options and a larger family room for young people to bring their friends or family members.

"Our centre renovation has been well overdue, and we are grateful to the community and the Primary Healthcare Network (PHN) for supporting this project," Rikki said.

"A fresh, bright, warm and welcoming centre reduces many barriers for young people seeking support. Coupled with our amazing staff and services, we now have a space and the environment to continue supporting young people on the peninsula."

Rikki said the headspace Redcliffe team had remained a positive, genuine and friendly workplace over

the years, despite challenges like Covid, which increased wait times and required a waitlist management strategy.

"Afternoon art groups started predominantly for young people on the waitlist, where they could develop friendships, increase social skills, feel less anxious and boost confidence," she said. "It was and remains a fabulous way for young people to start feeling comfortable in our space until they have their first session with a clinician."

The Cheers to 10 Years celebration will have free pizza, soft drinks, fairy floss, activities, donuts, community stalls and live music.

Looking ahead, Rikki said headspace Redcliffe would "continue to support the Peninsula's young people in their mental health journey and to break the stigma of help-seeking."

onstruction has begun on the new Peninsula Support Hub in Redcliffe, a \$6.7 million initiative led by City of Moreton Bay to combat the homelessness crisis.

The facility, funded by the council and the State Government's South East Queensland Community Stimulus Program, aims to provide a vital resource for those experiencing homelessness in the region.

Mayor Peter Flannery said the hub would give local service providers The Breakfast Club and Salvation Army a base to reach more people experiencing homelessness and connect them to the services they need.

"It will also serve as a friendly space where anyone can get a warm meal from the commercial grade kitchen, access the shower and laundry facilities and share conversation with old and new friends," he said. Division 6 Councillor Karl Winchester said the facility would provide people with the immediate support they need.

"Council is proud to be delivering this new home for The Breakfast Club and The Salvation Army who are doing so much for those doing it tough," he said.

President of The Breakfast Club, Michelle Gilchrist, said the new hub would provide better facilities for them to create a safe space for everyone.

"Our guests have raised concerns around food and housing insecurity, social connection, accessing services and mental health, so it's great that this hub will be able to create better access to many beneficial services," Ms Gilchrist said.

GARDENING COLUMN

ORGANIC GARDENING IN AUGUST

Golden grevillea

THOSE NOTORIOUS EKKA WINDS CAN PLAY HAVOC WITH YOUR GARDEN!

et's look at what we can do to protect our precious plants from strong, dry winds. Mulching is great any time of year but is especially important now in helping to prevent the soil around your plants from drying out. There are several mulches, including hay or straw, sugarcane leaf, woodchip or your own grass clippings or compost. Mulching is an immediate solution with many benefits to the soil, which in turn keeps plants stronger and healthier.

Planting in containers is a good option for windsensitive plants in winter months as the container can be moved to a sheltered area as necessary.

Solid fences, for example, timber or Colorbond steel, and hedges create a wind shadow which reduces the impact of wind on your garden. Plant or place delicate species in this protected zone.

Structures such as bamboo screening or shade cloth on a frame can be used as temporary windbreaks. They are useful in protecting young trees that you may be growing as a more permanent solution too.

Consider planting a windbreak if sea breezes and westerly winds are often whooshing through your garden. Choose native plants that grow locally.

Plant wind-resistant species such as lomandra (almost unkillable), protea, grevillea and banksia. Those last three are great choices as they produce stunning flowers for much of the year and attract bees, birds and butterflies.

This isn't just for plants – you too will enjoy the warmth of winter sunshine in your wind-protected garden!

ou've never seen a film like this before. A bold statement I know, but from the opening credits you'll be blown away by the creativity and ingenuity of Hundreds of Beavers.

In this story of survival and revenge set in the 19th century, an applejack farmer's crop is destroyed by a bunch of beavers. He'll have to survive in the freezing cold with nothing but his wits and a fetching pair of long johns to brave the winter.

Although there is this overarching story, Hundreds of Beavers is more like a collection of black-and-white cartoons mixed with a Buster Keaton silent film. From one scene to the next, you never know what's around the corner. What really helps set Hundred of Beavers apart is its mix of live-action and animation and oh yeah, did I mention that the beavers are people in costumes? Well they are, and it's just another original aspect of this film to enjoy. I know it may sound like a lot of things thrown together but somehow it all fits nicely into a fun tale. Written and directed by Mike Cheslik, you can see the love that has gone into creating this world and the characters who inhabit it, meaning that the behind-the-scenes videos are almost as entertaining to watch as the feature itself. The cast, crew and creator have worked hard to stretch their budget and still deliver a quality feature. By the director's own admission, the black-and-white style helps hide a multitude of sins.

In keeping with the old-timey style, hardly a word is spoken, letting the fun score and musical numbers help embed you in this cartoon world. If this film has one flaw, it's the length – it's just too long. However, the constant change of scenery and mini-stories helps the movie tick over.

Hundreds of Beavers can be enjoyed by almost everyone, but I can't imagine that younger kids will sit through a black-and-white movie with an almost two-hour runtime.

Rug up and lose yourself in this fantastically imaginative adventure.



Registered and microchipped pets with up-todate information have a much better chance of being quickly reunited with their owners if they go missing.

With Moreton Bay's growing population, there are many new pet owners in the area. New residents should remember that all dogs and cats must be registered within 14 days of moving into the city or by 12 weeks of age. Discounts apply for desexed animals and concessions are available for eligible pet owners, such as pensioners. Please inform Council if you have changed address or contact details, your pet has passed away or been rehomed, your pet has been desexed (a reduced fee may apply), you are now eligible for a pensioner discount, or you would like to receive registration renewal notices by email. *To update your pet's registration details, visit the Council's website or call 3205 0555.*



The building extension at the Deception Bay Gem Club is nearing completion, and construction on the new community garden near the Maota Fona, Deception Bay has commenced.

Council is currently planning to deliver koala exclusion fencing to help protect our local koalas living in the Chelsea Street Environmental Reserve. This area (and particularly Anzac Avenue) experiences a very high number of wildlife-vehicle-collisions involving koalas. The installation of fauna safety infrastructure will help to improve road safety for wildlife and drivers.

City of Moreton Bay has also approved a \$300,000 grant to support the Redcliffe District Rugby League Club to upgrade lighting for its junior fields at Talobilla Park.

Previously in July, there were multiple Parliamentary Sitting Weeks, where I was down in Canberra representing you.

You will have seen that the Coalition announced a nuclear and renewables policy heading into the next Federal Election. The proposed seven locations for zero-emissions nuclear power plants are power stations that have closed or are scheduled to close.

Out of the world's 20 largest economies, Australia is the only one not using nuclear energy, or moving towards it. Importantly, nuclear means lower power prices for families and businesses.

Sharon Alback is a quietly spoken, modest individual. Other than those involved with her lifelong passion for dance, few would know of her great achievements in Queensland and Australia, as a creative dance spirit.

She has danced and organised dance in Australia for over 70 years and was the first dance teacher in Queensland to gain a full teaching diploma with the Commonwealth Society of Teachers of Dancing. She is only one of 10 Australian dance teachers to hold a Life Membership in Comdance.

For ten years she convened the dance section of the Redcliffe Eisteddfod, until it closed. Cyclone Buninyong

893 was a year remembered by past residents of Redcliffe as their worst year yet. Settling in Redcliffe had never been easy. Brisbane was a long way off, with sometimes infrequent ferry, poor road connections and no rail link. But February 1893 caused many to wonder why they had settled there. It was the year that Cyclone Buninyong hit South East Queensland and Redcliffe, in particular. The cyclone tracked its destructive path across Moreton Bay, having already caused major damage further up the coast near Yeppoon, where it had smashed buildings and uprooted trees. Further down the coast at Caloundra, it wrecked the 225-tonne steamer Dickey, as well as causing the death of several people, including two children.



Buninyong directly hit Scotts Point in Woody Point, sweeping across the suburb's coast road. It smashed fences, unroofed and destroyed houses and headed for Clontarf. Here, it destroyed iconic resident Mrs Bell's house. A piano was the instrument that saved her life, by allowing her to shelter

underneath it! A horse was killed, hit by flying metal, and its buggy was lifted and ended up in the fork of one of the few remaining trees left standing.

Another Clontarf house was lifted from its stumps and completely turned around, while its occupants enjoyed breakfast. Unbelievably, the children's breakfast plates remained unbroken.

The cyclone continued its destructive path, destroying more houses, racing across Hays Inlet and ending up in Zillmere, where it petered out.

But the resultant 'rain bomb' flooded local rivers, causing massive damage to Brisbane town and surrounds. It was named The Great Flood of 1893 and caused 35 deaths.

Nowadays, Redcliffians have learned to live with the threat of destructive cyclones, as we did when Cyclone Dora crossed our coast in 1971. The roof of a block of units was blown off, as well as other building structural damage. The Queensland coast averages six cyclones a year, but with climate change, the frequency could increase.



HISTORY REDCLIFFE

It could fairly be said that some of the Redcliffe Peninsula's first European sojourners were not exactly upstanding citizens.

REDCLIFFE'S CONVICTS

STORY PATTIE TANCRED

he first of these rascals to intrude upon the life of the peninsula's Ningi Ningi people were three thoroughly lost convicts, Thomas Pamphlett, Richard Parsons and John Finnegan, who had, in March 1823, left Sydney to travel to the Illawarra on a timbergetting mission. Disastrously blown off course, 101 days later, after an epic journey drifting and walking north, they came, in June, to what is now Clontarf Point where they were befriended by some Ningi Ningi men. After living and travelling with them for five months, Pamphlett and Finnegan were rescued by John Oxley in November. Parsons was separately found by Oxley the following year.

The next convicts to set foot on the peninsula were the 29 aboard the Amity, which arrived in September 1824 under the command of Lieutenant Miller, who was tasked with establishing a penal colony. When Redcliffe proved unsuitable for the purpose, the colony moved to the Brisbane River (which had been "discovered" and crossed by Pamphlett, Finnegan and Parsons during their trek north) in May 1825.

Among the Amity convicts who continued their sentences in the second settlement was one Thomas Mills. Mills, a thief, had arrived in Sydney on the Eliza in 1820. He was among a group who, in 1825, escaped by stealing a barge, sailing downriver and heading south along the coast. They made it to near Port Macquarie where they were recaptured. Mills was tried in Sydney and returned to Moreton Bay (again on the Amity) where he remained for another year before being sent back to Sydney. Reported to be "an incorrigible character", he died in 1868 after a life of continued offending.

Another Amity convict who decided that the Brisbane River colony was not for him was Lewis Lazarus, a 14-year-old tailor tried in 1817 in London for stealing, and transported to Sydney, arriving in 1818. After serving time in Newcastle he was selected to embark for Moreton Bay. In the General Quarterly Return of Public Labour for the colony in 1825, Lazarus was listed as "assistant cook at prisoners' barracks". In 1826, he and three other convicts absconded and headed into the bush. He returned, was punished and remained in Brisbane until 1832 after over seven years at the Moreton Bay colony.

Most of the Amity convicts were returned to Sydney, many to reoffend and continue incarceration elsewhere, their time at Redcliffe and Brisbane clearly far from rehabilitative.

AUSTRALIAN COWNOSE RAY RHINOPTERA NEGLECTA

he Australian Cownose Ray occurs in most of eastern and northern Australia and in Papua New Guinea. A strange looking ray with a cow like snout (hence the name), brown on top and usually white or pale underneath. Growing to about 140cm wide, they are usually seen in schools and are quite abundant in the shallow waters of Moreton Bay.

They have flat, plate-like teeth that are used to crush and grind crabs, prawns and other crustaceans they feed on in the sand. Australian Cownose Rays, like other stingrays, have a stinging barb on their tail that is used to protect themselves if they are threatened by other animals. They are not considered a threat to man as the sting is rarely if ever fatal. It also differs from other ray species in that it rarely rests on the bottom, minimizing the chance that someone might step on one. Not a species known for eating.




