



# REDCLIFFE FLORAL AND ART FESTIVAL

he earth laughs in flowers, as Ralph Waldo Emerson once observed, so it would follow that the Redcliffe Floral and Art Festival, which combines artistic expression with blooms and foliage, cannot be beaten for merriment.

The Clontarf-based festival is set to happen over a Friday to Sunday interval in June at St Peter the Fisherman Anglican Church and includes live music, art exhibits, floral displays, gardening tips and much more.

Organiser Liz Peters said this year's event promised more excitement than ever, partly due to the new addition of Redcliffe's Scottish Pipe Band (accompanied by drums, pipes, and full regalia) – scheduled to perform on the Sunday of the event, from 11am to 2pm.

"This year's theme is 'Celebrations' where weddings, birthdays, Valentine's Day, Easter, Christmas, and Halloween will be highlighted," Ms Peters said.

With New Year in Scotland being referred to as Hogmanay, the Scottish Pipe Band music brings a unique Highlands twist to the overall theme, especially for those with Celtic heritage.

Such a spectacle is expected to tie in nicely with a floral and artistic flourish, with attendees given the opportunity to decorate a gift, a wine glass, or a bottle of wine and to be shown other floristry-based tips.

"For the gardening enthusiasts, there are succulents and cacti on sale, and a large plant stall will have plenty of bargains," Ms Peters said.

Specialists will demonstrate various botanic arts, such as how to prune and maintain bonsai, bind Japanese kokedama, make macramé potholders, and construct a terrarium.


Ms Peters said there were no admission charges, but any money dropped into donation buckets would be appreciated.

"Donations are directed to local support groups and charities, and patronising the event is also an opportunity to support local musicians, artists and school students," she said.

The festival, which is now in its seventh year, has proved to be extremely successful in attracting not only local visitors but those from greater Brisbane and beyond.

"There have been friendships made, renewed, re-found and tales of unexpected meetings from school days," Ms Peters said, proving that flowers have the ability to not only bring joy but to bring people together.

# **BROTHERS** BAND TOGETHER TO END LONELINESS

t all starts when a concerned and loving person connects us to a person who feels lonely. This is the objective that local organisation Band of Brothers facilitates, and together with several initiatives and a community grant from Kedron-Wavell, they have been able to impact social isolation and loneliness in the community.

According to Bryan Wiseman, President of Band of Brothers, the group reaches out to people who may need more connection and support via a weekly telephone call, and then expands on this to "build bridges of friendship".

"We then find out what could interest and motivate this person to connect with the community, for example, they might enjoy fishing or shopping, and then we actively facilitate introduction and follow-up," Mr Wiseman said.

According to Mr. Wiseman, loneliness can result in social isolation, mental illness, and even chronic illnesses.

Recent Australian research reveals that feeling lonely affects one in three Australians, but as many as one in two try to cover it up.

"Not only is loneliness a taboo subject, it's also the scourge of our community for probably over 21,000 people in Redcliffe - so let's talk about it and take the time to engage with people feeling lonely," he said.

In light of this, Band of Brothers has stepped up their efforts with the recent launch of a poster campaign, their preparation for Ending Loneliness Together Week (a nationwide social awareness initiative) and the planning of a 'Senior's Party' to be held later this year.

They are also working towards providing temporary crisis accommodation for unhoused people and secure overnight parking for women and children sleeping in their vehicles, as well as care packages for those in need.

They call these 'Hope Bags' (filled with goodies as well as notes of friendship and encouragement), with Mr Wiseman saying they "cost about \$30 each, but it's well worth seeing the smiles on the faces of people who are homeless".

"The support of Kedron Wavell RSL and the Cornerstone Group, plus many kind people, is appreciated," he said.

To make a difference personally (and also for local

"To be invited to perform and showcase our culture, through not only fatele but also through our unique cultural attire, will always be an honour for us to do so for our tiny island home," Ms Tepa Haleti said.

# TRIBUTE BAND HONOURS **LEGENDARY 1988 PINK FLOYD TOUR**

ustralia's top Pink Floyd tribute band, Echoes of Pink Floyd, is returning to Redcliffe with their latest concert experience, Signs of Life. This show will celebrate Pink Floyd's 1988 Australian tour, the last time the band visited the country, and their live album Delicate Sound of Thunder.

Echoes of Pink Floyd lead vocalist Matt Goodluck said they would be performing many of the songs from the 1988 tour, allowing fans to relive memories of that time.

"While the show still features all of the band's classic hits, it has a particular focus on Pink Floyd's 80's output, which is something we've not done before," Matt said.

"One highlight for fans of the 80's era is that we are performing all of the A Momentary Lapse of Reason album (which Pink Floyd did on that tour) – something that no other Pink Floyd tribute does. The reason being that those songs are quite musically challenging but it's been great fun for us to replicate those songs along with all of the big standout hits from the band."

The setlist will include popular album tracks, including Learning to Fly and On the Turning Away, as well as lesser-known gems like Yet Another Movie. The show will also feature videos as a backdrop to the music.

"I think it's really important to keep mixing up the set list every couple of years to keep it interesting for both us and the fans," Matt said.

"We've had such great feedback on this tour about the songs we're playing and how it's brought back a lot of memories for those that attended those iconic shows back in 1988."

The six-piece band from Adelaide, featuring guitarists Daniel Hunter and Mark MacNab, drummer Jason Miller, keyboardist Paul Bindig, and bassist Tony Coppola, will be joined by saxophonist Ben Westphal and vocalist Bree Gregory for this tour.

Matt said the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre was a fantastic venue in a beautiful part of the country.

"The audience were so enthusiastic last time, which is why we're back," he said. "We really love it when the crowd audibly gets into the music. It becomes a great exchange of energy between the band and the audience and that's what live shows are all about."

On Saturday, 6 July, Mark will perform his most popular hits in his show, The Best So Far.

Mark, who shot to fame after winning Australia's Got Talent in 2009 at the age of 15, said his repertoire included Hallelujah and Nessun Dorma.

"Audiences can expect a calibration of songs from musical theatre, arias and classic ballads that I've been known for over the years," he said.

"Nessun Dorma for me is an aria like no other. It's the party piece of my show. If I don't do this aria, people yell out for it.

"For me, it's great to experience the audience's

reactions from different areas around the country. Make me always believe that being a performer is who I am and what I'm meant to be doing.

"The hardest thing is being away from my wife and children. It can get lonely on the road touring but this is the business I'm in. It's all part of the journey."

Mark began singing at the age of 9 when he was inspired by his grandfather and the music of American actor and tenor, Mario Lanza.

After struggling to find the right singing teacher, Mark eventually met a special woman named Mrs Gould.



"She was the only person who never gave up on me," he said. "To think I went through five different singing teachers prior to her and each teacher said the same thing: 'We can't help Mark. He can't take on music direction.' Mrs Gould saw something in me and from that moment I started with her. I never looked back."

Mark's career has been on the upward ever since, working with artists like Dame Julie Andrews and recording the album A Tribute to Mario Lanza, which features a virtual duet with the legendary tenor.

> He said paying tribute to Mario was a great honour.

"Having Mario Lanza's only living daughter, Elisa, giving me permission to do this project is something I'll never forget," he said. "I'll always cherish this close to my heart."


"Flowering tea, also known as blooming tea, is a special type of handcrafted tea that offers a unique and visually stunning experience," Ms Salau said.

At London, on the 12th October, 1854, Dr. Walter Scott, late of Eskdale, Hinton, an old and respected colonist. Dr. Scott's death will cause regret and sorrow through a wide circle of friends in this district, by whom he was highly esteemed.

# **MR SURGEON** WALTER SCOTT: **QUEENSLAND'S** FIRST DOCTOR

STORY PATTIE TANCRED

mong the 70-odd people - soldiers, convicts, wives and children of soldiers - who came ashore in September 1824 at Red Cliff Point, site of the soon-to-be established Moreton Bay penal settlement, was one Mr Walter Scott, a civilian, that is, neither soldier nor convict.

Described in the diary of a fellow passenger as "Commissariat Storekeeper (acting also in the Capacity as a Surgeon)", Mr Scott was responsible for the supervision of both the health of his fellow colonists and the supply of stores and rations.

Scott was born in Scotland in 1787. As a young man, he undertook a surgeon's apprenticeship (the usual path to the practice of surgery in those days), after which, in 1819, he enrolled for two years as a medical student at the University of Edinburgh. In 1822 he embarked on the Regalia for the life of a colonist, arriving in Sydney in early 1823. His first few months in New South Wales were taken up with the selection of a parcel of land in the Hunter River region. On returning to Sydney, he was appointed to a position in the colonial government as a commissariat officer, dealing with procurement and distribution of stores.

Thus, it was in the dual capacity of surgeon and supplies officer that Scott took ship on the Amity with the 40th Regiment of Foot under Lieutenant Miller to Moreton Bay to found the first convict settlement in what would become Queensland. Among the priorities in the fledgling colony was the unloading of supplies and the construction of secure premises for their storage - theft of provisions and implements was a real threat - and the first commissariat store, constructed under Scott's supervision, was erected within 14 days of the landing, Thereafter, he was responsible for the care and distribution of implements, food and other materials.

As the settlement's medical officer, Scott would have been kept busy treating whatever ailments and injuries the colonists presented with, among which were dysentery, heat exhaustion, fevers and, probably, in the absence of fresh vegetables, scurvy. On a happier note, having trained in midwifery at Edinburgh, he would have been invaluable to the three pregnant women, Mrs Miller, Mrs Thompson and Mrs Cox, who had accompanied their soldier husbands.

It is to the credit of Mr Surgeon Scott that, despite the conditions - rudimentary sanitation, inadequate nutrition, poor water and infestations of mosquitos - only one death, that of a soldier, was recorded during the tenure of the colony at Redcliffe. In addition, the three babies born there flourished and went on to live long lives.

When the settlement transferred to the Brisbane River, Scott served there until October 1826, when he returned to Sydney and his former duties in the commissariat. He later took up the life of a landowner and pastoralist in the Hunter Valley. He returned to England, in ill health, in 1854 and died in London, probably of cholera, later that year.

# **MOVIE REVIEW**



STORY WATCHITWOMBAT

et in bleak rural America, we follow the story of Louis (Stephan James), who, after a childhood accident, is left with a mental impairment and is raised by his sister, Delia. After waking up to find her dead body on his kitchen floor, he is accused of her murder and sentenced to five years in prison.

Having served his time in jail, he now lives in a voluntary institution, where he is visited by 'Stacker' (Travis Fimmel), one of the last people to see his sister alive.

Claiming to know more about Delia's murder, he sets Louis on a path to uncover who is really responsible for her mysterious death.

Travis Fimmel is incredible in Vikings, but I've never seen him break free of that character, offering the same performance on repeat. However, this is the closest I've seen him come to breaking free of that mould – cast as a broken man trying to rebuild his life and his family.

As Louis leaves a path of destruction in his wake, he is pursued by ex-sheriff Fran, played by Marisa Tomei, who is uncharacteristically but deliberately unlikeable.

What helps set this film apart from most

murder mysteries is that instead of a grizzled detective who has solved countless cases, Louis sees the world differently and resorts to unorthodox methods to find the clues and answers he needs

The plot isn't overly complicated, but I think this was a conscious decision made by the filmmakers because if it were, it would make it less believable that Louis could follow a complex investigation.

This film isn't an action-packed revenge thriller like John Wick. It's far more bleak and closer in style to True Detective. It may not be everyone's cup of tea, as the slow pacing and sparse landscapes can make it feel quite laboured in places. However, as it only runs for 90 minutes, it's closer to watching an episode on Netflix than a feature film.

Some solid performances from the leads, an interesting concept and an intriguing murder to solve.

If you're looking for a revenge crime thriller with a difference, then Delia's Gone is worth your time.



early 20 years ago, a young couple Tina Fullerton and Warwick Hargreaves teamed up and created a musical duo. They called




WITH RICHARD LANCASTER themselves Out of Abingdon after the Woolloongabba street they had lived in before settling in Redcliffe. For the next five years, they called the Peninsula home, and they entertained a growing number of fans, principally at coffee houses in Scarborough Village. Their unique musical style, which covered jazz, folk, blues and groove genres played by songstress Tina on


the double bass coupled with Warwick's guitar accompaniment assured their continued popularity.

But they soon attracted interest from Brisbane and settled there, where they continued to add to their massive fan base. In turn, the rest of Australia beckoned and in a specially built 'home truck' they travelled the country, performing in cafes and festivals, predominantly in New South Wales and Victoria. Averaging 100 performances a year, this dynamic twosome kept their audiences enthralled.

Interest from overseas saw the duo tour Europe no less than four times, playing at major venues in London, Edinburgh, Paris and Berlin. By this time, they had released three albums of their songs and created their fourth in India, where they were accompanied by noted Indian musicians.

Their latest album Red Dirt Tracks forms the basis of the musical two-performance program they presented at Redcliffe's The Loft in December last year. Currently, they are touring Queensland in their home truck and hope to be back on the Peninsula for more performances. # **DUSKY FLATHEAD** PLATYCEPHALUS FUSCUS

f you have ever heard a fisherman say they caught a huge 'lizard' this is what they are talking about.

This time of year around Sandgate and Shorncliffe is perfect for catching this tasty estuary species, although they are around all year. The mouth of Cabbage Tree Creek and along the Sandgate/ Brighton foreshore is excellent at high tide.

Identified easily by a single black dot on the end of the tail, they are often confused with other species, such as sand and bar-tailed flathead.

Growing to over one metre long and quite the predator at this size, you can only take them between 40cm and 75cm in Queensland as the larger breeding female fish are crucial to replenish natural stocks. My favourite way to catch them is with a light rod, braided line and a soft plastic lure that is bounced on and off the bottom as you wind in, but they will take many lures, and drifting with bait works well, too.

They love the warm, shallow, weedy edges of sand banks and mouths of creeks and rivers in the last few hours of the outgoing tide, where they wait to



ambush their prey.

Japanese friends of mine tell me it's the best

sashimi they have tried in Australia, I still like mine steamed whole or beerbattered fillets though, thanks.
