

REDCLIFFE'S FIRST 80 YEARS EVOLUTION OR REVOLUTION?

he first formal sale of crown land in the 'Redcliff [sic] Agricultural Reserve' took place on 14 July 1862 and within 20 years canny investors were starting to recognise the peninsula's potential as a seaside resort, leading to the large, formerly agricultural landholdings or "estates" being broken up and sold as smaller building allotments. The first of these, the 'Redcliffe Estate', comprising "60 magnificent marine villa sites", went under the hammer in 1881 and the 1880s land boom was underway. The next phase of development for this "really very beautiful watering place" - as described by a correspondent to the Brisbane Courier - had begun.

Development and population growth created a need for local government. Initially, Redcliffe was part of the Caboolture Division, one of the 73 divisions into which Queensland was divided by the Divisional Boards Act of 1879. It soon became obvious that the Caboolture Division – governed by its divisional board in Caboolture, 15 miles distant from Humpybong – was too large to be managed efficiently and residents of the peninsula began to campaign for separation from Caboolture, alleging "general neglect of their interests". After years of petitions and meetings, they were eventually successful and the Redcliffe Division came into being in 1888. The Redcliffe Divisional Board had its work cut out for it. Rates and their collection were priority matters as were the provision of a

water supply and the lamentable state of the roads, bridges, drains and jetties, which was exacerbated by occasional natural disasters, such as the flooding of 1893. As time went on, the board's concerns broadened to include issues such as clearing the peninsula of noxious weeds, the possible provision of a Humpybong railway connection and "by-laws to regulate public bathing".

The board initially met in Brisbane (prompting some complaints from ratepayers that public works were, as a result, neglected and/or unsupervised). They continued this remote governance until 1893 when they began meeting in the School of Arts building at North Pine. In 1901, the board took out a loan to enable the construction of permanent premises. The new office was opened in June 1902.

The Redcliffe Divisional Board continued to operate until the Local Government Act of 1902 changed divisional boards into shire councils and the Redcliffe Shire Council came into being on 3 April 1903: the transformation from Ningi Ningi homeland to shire government had taken fewer than 80 years.

t's been months in the making and now the production of Panic in Pipton is ready to grace the stage.

The brainchild of playwright/musical director Andrew Munslow, Panic in Pipton is an original musical production with a 'The War of the Worlds story' and is described by the team as The Secret Life of Walter Mitty meets The Night that Panicked America.

Andrew grew up listening to The War of the Worlds musical version by Jeff Wayne.

"I would turn off all the lights and in a pitch-black room listen to the story unfold to the music," Andrew said. "I've had several ideas about how to put on a War of the Worlds musical but decided to write a musical based on the real-life events that unfolded on the night that Orson Welles and the Mercury Theatre Company presented their radio version of H.G. Wells' The War of the Worlds.

"To incorporate the songs into the story, I wrote my main character, Sam, as a dreamer who drifts off into fantasy – this is when the songs are performed during the show – we are hoping to can audiences expect from this show?

"They will get to experience our lead character Sam's mind!" Deb said. "The show is set in a country pub the night of The War of the Worlds broadcast, however, Sam, a young dreamer, quite often drifts off into her imagination and we get to experience the songs she imagines there with her. It's a fun and different concept that will let us present a range of songs to the audience, from original works written by Andrew to popular music by ELO, Queen and more, in total 12 songs interwoven into a unique storyline. Watching the progress with each rehearsal is so exciting. We can't wait for the end product."

The show features a cast of 15, four band members (with an extra drummer helping in rehearsals) and seven in design/sound/ lighting/backstage crew, plus the director and musical director.



MOVEMENT EMPOWERS SURVIVORS OF DOMESTIC ABUSE

he Miracle Mums Movement is transforming the lives of mums who have escaped abusive relationships. The initiative is dedicated to supporting and empowering single mothers as they create a positive future.

The new programme launching soon offers free, weekly in-person sessions on the Redcliffe Peninsula to transform your life. The pilot project has been funded by The Komo.

The project is led by Lou Feltham Smith who is Australia's head leader for Mums in Business International and the leader of the Mums in Business Moreton Bay group.

"In 2016, I escaped domestic abuse," Lou said. "When I'd left the abusive relationship, I didn't want to go back to work full-time in corporate so I decided to look for a work-from-home opportunity. I started off in a network marketing company and through this, I found Mums in Business. I loved it so much, so when the opportunity came up to be the leader of the Moreton Bay group, I jumped at the chance.

"Two years ago, I was approached to be the head leader for Australia, so now I recruit, train

and support all of the other Mums in Business leaders around Australia.

"The idea for Miracle Mums Movement was actually born four years ago. I'd gone through a lot of personal development to get myself out of the victim space and into a mindset of growth.

"I thought how great it would be if there was a service that holds your hands after you've left abuse and shows you the way so you can get out of the victim mindset and not let that abuse define you. Something to give you the opportunity to grow as a person and to create the life of your dreams.

"There was nothing like that out there, so I decided to create it."

The team is made up of survivors who have transformed their own lives and now dedicate themselves to helping others on their journey.

With expert guest speakers, a like-minded community and connections to services that can support your unique situation, participants will be surrounded by the support they need to craft a positive new beginning for their family.

FRODO RETURNS TO MIDDLE EARTH... SORT OF.

lijah Wood is back in New Zealand for his latest film Bookworm, but he's not the hero this time around. It's 11-year-old Mildred (Nell Fisher), whose life is just how she likes it - living a quiet existence alone in her room immersed in a book with the occasional interruption from her Mum.

That all changes when her Mum is hospitalised and her tranquil lifestyle is interrupted by the arrival of her estranged father (Wood). The has-been illusionist has his work cut out for him when his daughter is unamused by his magical antics, but more because he's been absent from her life for the last 11 years.

To win her over, he agrees to embark on a camping trip with Mildred in search of the legendary New Zealand creature The Canterbury Panther. If they can grab footage of the mythical beast, they'll pocket a reward that will (conveniently) cover her mother's medical bills. So, this is a kids' film, most of the time. Think Bridge to Terabithia meets Hunt for the Wilderpeople. The adventure and the performances are light and fun but occasionally some darker themes will creep in. This odd mixture of light and dark is part of what makes Bookworm more interesting than other kids' movies. That, and Kiwi wunderkind Nell Fisher, who at the age of 13 is familiar with dark themes herself. Having already appeared in Evil Dead Rise and Stranger Things, Fisher steals the show, delivering one droll line after another – 'cause kids are funny when they talk like old people. Think Young Sheldon in the woods.

It may sound like a simple story but the pace of the film is bolstered by the characters they meet along the way.

Bookworm brings enough emotion for the adults and fun for the little ones. Most of the slightly more morbid themes will go over a young kid's head, but go in knowing that some more curious kids may have questions afterwards. Please don't let that stop you though, this is a fun adventure that everyone can enjoy.



where are clearly a dog loving nation. Some nearly six and a half million dogs hold special places in our collective town, city and bush hearts. Nearly 50% of all pets, are dogs. Each owner spends an average of between one to five thousand dollars on their furry mate, which annually amounts up to a massive total of \$20.5 billion. Social media is full to overflowing with dog's birthday celebrations, lost dog notices and sadly remembrances of dog mates since passed!



I was reminded of this, by a friend's recent dog dilemma. She was faced with a life-threatening car accident involving her precious dachshund, Lady. The initial diagnosis was serious. Lady's pelvis was broken in two places and several other serious injuries as well. If my friend decided to risk an operation, the estimated cost was a substantial and a satisfactory

outcome was not guaranteed. However, good news was on the way, a second diagnosis revealed that her leg was broken, not her pelvis. Lady's leg was operated on, and she is now progressing well.

But bad news never really goes away! My precious Staffie Mylie had recently developed a limp in her right rear leg, so off to the Vet we went. The initial diagnosis was acute arthritis, but that changed to a damaged cruciate ligament, which would require an operation.

During the next few weeks, I noticed that her injured leg had developed a large hard lump. A second round of X-rays and blood tests revealed a sinister result. It was Osteosarcoma, the medical term for bone cancer, a highly aggressive form of cancer in dogs. Now I was faced with an even more difficult decision! An operation would involve removing her leg with no guarantee that the cancer had not spread any further. I was devastated. Without therapy, Miley could live for another 2 months. With amputation, her survival may extend to 6 months, provided there were no further complications. I made the decision to give Miley the chance to live life with me for as long as she was pain free and comfortable, without the operation.

But that fateful day arrived. I could no longer ask her to continue to give me that wonderful companionship I have enjoyed with her, knowing she was bearing pain. And now, I will cry tears of sadness and later look at the urn on my dressing table, which will contain her ashes and say, "I really loved you and always will!"

MUSCLE -NATURE'S SPANX!

hen you have muscle, you may weigh more on the scales, but your body is tighter, and everything fits and looks better. So, it's not weight, it's body composition.

What is Body Composition? Body Composition is the percentage of fat, muscle, and bone in your body. Your body composition is far more important than the body weight



on the scales. It differentiates between fat mass and lean mass (muscle, bone, organs) which have different health implications.

Are you getting enough nutrition? So, what happens when we just focus on losing weight and our primary method is calorie restriction (following a very low-calorie diet) or not eating enough nutritious food? It is clear from many studies and research that if we only calorie restrict, with nothing else like lifting weights to build muscle, we will lose 25 to 50% of our weight as muscle.

Let me say that again; when we focus on weight loss and we follow a very low-calorie diet alone, 25 - 50% of weight loss is due to muscle loss!

That makes us metabolically less healthy because muscle is a glucose sink. When we feed ourselves and there's sugar circulating in our bloodstream, it is taken up by our muscle

and then when we come off our crazy calorie-restricted diet the weight we gain back is 80% fat!

ORGANIC GARDENING IN SEPTEMBER

SOW YOUR HEIRLOOM VEGGIE SEEDS!

September is a beautiful time of year in the garden. The mild conditions are delightful for both you and your plants. A large range of vegetables thrive in the warming temperatures, so it's a great time to get seeds in the ground.

This year, consider sourcing 'heirloom' seeds for full-flavour produce without any 'nasties'. Heirloom varieties are old-fashioned favourites that have been passed down from generation to generation because of their high yields and deliciousness.

Unlike most commercial seeds, heirloom seeds are open-pollinated, natural, non-hybrid, chemical-free, untreated and non-GMO. They are true to type, meaning you can save seed from a plant and expect to get the same thing when you plant the seeds next season – this doesn't happen with hybrid seeds.

Warmer weather also encourages a proliferation of pests and diseases. The best defence for your plants is to keep them strong and healthy, so keep the organic fertiliser up and provide adequate water.

What to plant now – tomato, eggplant, capsicum and chilli, pumpkin, cucumber, watermelon, rockmelon, sweetcorn, okra, snake beans and rosella.

Heirloom seeds are available online – remember to source from accredited Australian suppliers. Then keep your seeds from this year's crop to sow for FREE next season!

t's great to see more investment in Redcliffe. The Miles Government is partnering with the Albanese Government and City of Moreton Bay to deliver more than \$12 million

for the Suttons Beach Pavilion Public Space Project.

It was a real blow when we lost the Pavilion after nearly 90 years serving the Peninsula. That's why I advocated so hard for this funding. I love my community and want to thank all those who took

up the fight with me.

Additionally, the Redcliffe Harness Racing Club received \$100,000 to upgrade their race day stable facilities, and Clontarf Beach SHS received more than \$260,000 for their outdoor learning area project. As you know, all public transport fares are now 50 cents. An adult travelling from Kippa-Ring Station to the city five days a week will save \$245 a month, or \$1470 over six months. On the first day of the 50-cent fares, there were an extra 57,000 trips taken on public transport! ou will soon be receiving Garden Organics Wheelie Bins ahead of the service commencing in December. This initiative has been a long time coming and something



residents have been asking for. It will be the biggest change to household waste management since the introduction of recycling bins.

Council is carrying out an information campaign about how it will work and I encourage everyone to check in on what can and

can't go into the new wheelie bin. The new service will divert 15,000 tonnes of waste from landfill each year.

The renewed parkland and historical signage were delivered by Council in partnership with History Redcliffe and the Rotary Club of Redcliffe Sunrise.

DON'T BE A TANK TIPPER!

nfortunately, our local creeks and ponds are full of feral fish species and aquatic weeds. Most of these have been released by people or overflowed from ponds in heavy rain.

Your local creek or pond is not the place to dump unwanted aquarium fish, weeds or snails. They could introduce diseases into the environment. They also compete for food, eat juvenile native fish and eggs, uproot and eat plants and can completely take over waterways, leaving virtually no native fish at all. Humpybong Creek and Dowse Lagoon are prime examples of areas where feral fish have taken over.

You should rehome your fish by:

- Taking them to your local aquarium specialty store or pet shop
- Giving them away to a friend
- Advertising them for free on social media.

Consider stocking one of the many interesting and colourful species of native Australian fish in your aquariums and ponds. They present less risk to our environment if they escape during flooding events.




