

n today's bustling world, connecting to some gentle movement, meditation and the soothing sound of crystal bowls - against the backdrop of a beautiful Margate Beach sunrise - sounds like just the ticket.

What's more, is that these monthly events, aptly titled Sunrise, Sound and Stillness, continue to be free to the public.

According to organiser and somatic experience practitioner Brent Elton, the events are the result of wanting to make a difference for people in terms of mindfulness and wellness.

"I love teaching movement and meditation and wanted to find a way to give back to the community that was sustainable for me," Mr Elton said.

The events start early and include a twominute TED-type talk followed by some light movement and meditation, interspersed with the soothing chime of sound bowls.

"Mix in some humour, warmth and a group photo and you have Sunrise, Sound and Stillness in a nutshell." Mr Elton said.

Mr Elton said that after spending a year abroad, he and his spouse came back with some

ideas on making the events bigger and better and that attendance and support had been amazing.

"The numbers quickly grew from 30 to 130 participants and counting, and one of the most helpful things for us has been the sound system donated to us by a participant," he said.

According to Mr Elton, his primary role as a somatic experience practitioner has allowed him to assist individuals in recovering from PTSD, anxiety and trauma, and this informed his own mental health journey – a process he was only too happy to share with others.

"Whenever I run these sunrise events, I try my best to give people small, digestible lessons on how to regulate stress, process trauma and digest emotion," he said.

His advice for participants was to bring a yoga mat or towel, to be kind (to yourself and to others), and, for first-time attendees, to arrive a little early.

'Music and Skits: Sci-Fi Jubilee' celebrates the museum's Australia in Space: Earth and Beyond exhibition and the Beyond the Horizon Imaginarium.

St Benedict's College Choir will launch the jubilee with a celestial performance led by teacher Jenna-Maree Woodforth, a Star Wars fan with a love for all things space-related.

"The students have really enjoyed learning the new repertoire and are keen to share these songs with the community," Jenna said.

The choir will perform five starry numbers, including Fly Me to the Moon, Moondance and Jabba Flow from Star Wars.

Following the choir, nine talented young actors from Mousetrap Theatre will take to the stage with two skits and a one-act play.

Mousetrap Youth Workshop Drama Coordinator, Karen Christl, said the event was a wonderful opportunity for the students.

"This chance to perform in partnership with the museum shows the community that Mousetrap is still going strong after 70 years of being part of the local community," Karen said.

The skit, Space Race, written by student Liv Wood, explores the ageold question of who truly won the Space Race: the USA or the USSR?

In How the Constellations Got Their Names, written by Karen, audiences will travel back in time to discover how familiar constellations came to be.

Danger in Space, also written by Karen, is a 20-minute play where Captain Danger faces off against Empress Sia, leader of the mighty Drens, who has threatened to kidnap Princess Penelope.

Rounding off the event, the Australian Space Agency Adelaide will present a live telecast -Fact or Fiction?

Nate Taylor, Manager at the Australian Space Discovery Centre, said participants could test their space knowledge to distinguish between space facts and space fibs.

"During this online presentation you will be challenged with common (and not so common) ideas like, 'The asteroid field is dense', 'In space, no one can hear you scream', 'Mobile phones rely on space technology', 'We are already making oxygen on Mars', and many more examples," Nate said.

"Along the way, you may even learn about many of the cool ways we use and rely on space today."

Attendees are encouraged to dress up as their favourite space-themed characters or planets.

ver since truck driver David Gaudron wanted to surprise his truck-mad nephew back in 2006, Brisbane Convoy for Kids (BC4K) has been able to give back to kids and raise millions of dollars for children's charities in a torque-fueled way.

Described as "a spectacular sight of Brisbane's trucking community making a difference," BC4K is back this November to have the big rigs travel from Larapinta to the Redcliffe Showgrounds (where a spectacular family fun day will ensue).

Dana Browne, Public Officer BC4K, said that organisers were anticipating at least 1000 trucks in the convoy, an upward swing on last year's total of 932, plus a truckload of high-octane attractions afterwards at the showgrounds.

"There will be numerous food and market stalls. free amusement rides, an animal farm, our charity auction and fireworks," Ms Browne said.

A dedicated truck display and competition, the debut of the 2024 Trailer of Hope, and, of course, top musical artists Diesel and Travis Sinclair are all scheduled for the event, according to Ms Browne.

Golden Guitar winner Travis Sinclair said he was excited to perform at BC4K and added that his connection to trucks and the industry had always been an integral part of his life.

"It is such a great family of people in the trucking industry, and all throughout Australia - wherever you are - there is always someone you know and always someone to lend a hand when times get tough," he said.

Mr Sinclair said that BC4K made for a fantastic family day with some awesome trucks and it was always rewarding to see kids having fun and singing along to the music.

SOME PIONEERS: THE HA **FAMILY**

edcliffe's 200-year evolution from the exclusive preserve of its Indigenous peoples to the modern seaside suburban landscape we now enjoy owes much to the pioneers who settled here. They identified the peninsula's potential and set about making it a reality. Most of us would not recognise their names, but they are all around us, present on our street signs.

Take Ham Street, Kippa Ring: though tiny, it memorialises quite a slice of Redcliffe history in the form of the family of Thomas Ham, one of

the early pioneers of sugar growing on the peninsula. Born in 1821 in England, Thomas migrated first to Sydney in 1842, then to Melbourne where he worked as an engraver and publisher. He married Mary Jull Collings in 1851 and they moved to Brisbane and later to Redcliffe where they planned to farm. When he died in 1870, he was lauded in the Queenslander as a man of "genial and unassuming nature" with "the strongest faith in the country for the production of ... sugar".

His widow, Mary Jull Collings Ham, was a Redcliffe identity and it was after her that what is now Collins Street, Woody Point was named - the name having lost its 'g' at some


point. It was Mary who, in 1866, bought for £31 the family's first parcels of land – 36 acres – where a house was built and where the family lived. After Thomas's death - she gave birth to her youngest child the next day - Mary continued his plans to grow sugar cane despite, as she wrote afterwards, "the deep grief of losing a kind husband ... and the added burden of business perplexities". She made further investments in land and became a considerable landholder.

Mary and Thomas had nine children, among them John Collings Ham and Alfred Westbrook Ham. John, born in Melbourne in 1855, was, with his brother Alfred, a financier and real estate agent and Redcliffe landowner. He was elected to the first Redcliffe Divisional Board in 1888 and it was at his offices in Queen Street, Brisbane that the board met for the first five years of its existence. Elected chairman of the board in 1891, he served until the following year. He was remembered after his death in 1893 as "well-known in commercial financial, local government, and musical circles". Alfred (Alfred Street, Woody Point), was also elected to the Divisional Board, from 1893 until 1897, serving as chairman in 1895.

Among the many debts Redcliffe owes the Ham family are the names of three of its streets.

HEALTHY DRINKS TO KEEP YOU COOL & WELL

t's probably the most valuable, yet the most underutilised plant in your garden. Aloe vera is easy to grow and well-known for its ability to soothe burns, but did you know aloe vera brings those same healing properties to the rest of your body?

Local author of Cookin' for Cures, a cookbook featuring over 100 aloe vera-based recipes, Angie Andrews said drinking aloe vera juice regularly was a simple and natural way to stay much healthier.

"Aloe vera contains over 100 vitamins, minerals, amino acids and vital enzymes that help repair

and maintain the body's healthy cells while rejecting harmful cells," Angie said.

"This strengthens our immune system and assists in the healing of many diseases and ailments, including arthritis, diabetes, skin conditions and cold sores, to name just a few.

"Aloe vera has also been known to support those going through chemotherapy by reducing the side effects."

When purchasing aloe vera plants for consumption, it is vital to ascertain that they are of the barbadensis variety and at least two years old. Put them in full sun and water weekly for maximum gel.

Angie's top tips for preparation are to cut mature leaves at least 23cm long, wash thoroughly to remove yellow sap, trim sides and slice the top off with a sharp knife, then scrape the gel off the leaf.

"Most of the goodness in the gel lasts for about two hours, so use it straightaway or freeze as ice cubes," Angie said.

"Aloe has no flavour and blends well with juices and smoothies and other food. It helps keep you hydrated as well as healthy."

PINE-MELON CRUSH

2 slices pineapple

1 apple (cored and sliced)

2 slices watermelon

1 mango (peeled and sectioned)

1 aloe vera leaf (gel)

Place all ingredients in a juicer and blend. Add ice cubes to serve.

BAN-MANGO SMOOTHIE

1 banana

1 mango (peeled and sectioned)

1 cup vanilla yoghurt

1 aloe vera leaf (gel)

IS MUSCLE HEAVIER THAN FAT? A STRENGTH COACH'S PERSPECTIVE

s a strength coach for those over 50, a common question I hear is, "Is muscle heavier than fat?"
The short answer is no - a kilogram of muscle weighs the same as a kilogram of fat. However, the key

difference lies in their density.

Muscle is much more compact than fat. This means that muscle takes up less space in the body compared to fat. If you've been training consistently and notice your clothes fitting



better, but the scale isn't budging, this is likely because you're gaining muscle while losing fat. It's possible to see body composition changes, such as more toned arms or a firmer midsection, even without major weight loss.

This is particularly important for people over 50, as maintaining muscle mass becomes crucial with age. Muscle not only helps with balance and strength but also boosts metabolism. This allows your body to burn more calories, even at rest. Fat, on the other hand, serves as energy storage and is less metabolically active.

So, rather than fixating on the scale, focus on how you feel and perform. Building muscle improves your overall health, mobility and quality of life. Remember, muscle might not be 'heavier' than fat, but it's far more valuable

when it comes to staying fit and active as we age.



ne of the great pleasures of living on the Redcliffe Peninsula is taking in the cool sea air, which is only enhanced by biking along one of our local cycleways.

The Moreton Bay Regional Cycleway (MBRC) connects 150 kilometres of the Brisbane coastline, from Redcliffe to Manly, but there are plenty of paths in our own neighbourhood.

And hopping on a bicycle is a great experience for almost anybody, according to Jens Uhsemann, owner of Margate-based bike repair, servicing and restoration business StreetArtCycles.

"Riding a bike saves you the hassle of finding a parking spot, keeps you active and helps you stay healthy," Mr Uhsemann said.

The MBRC starts near Scarborough's Pirate Playgrounds, continues to the Redcliffe Foreshore (past the Redcliffe Markets on a Sunday morning) and winds its way alongside the popular Settlement Cove Lagoon.

You can continue through Margate and onto Woody Point past the Gayundah Wrecks (a perfect photo opportunity) and for more diehard riders, you can end your route at the Ted Smout Memorial Bridge.

For cyclists, whether casual or more advanced, keeping a bike in tip-top working condition is

important for not only performance but also longevity of equipment and rider safety.

Mr Uhsemann said that, overall, he was motivated to help people get on bikes and was happy to share his bike care advice.

"The most important thing is to keep your bike dry, clean and well-lubricated," he said.

Although it's definitely a good idea to make use of the City of Moreton Bay's many bike paths, according to Mr Uhsemann, every cycling journey starts at your front door.

"Just hop on, visit friends, head to the beach, or run errands," he said.

For those who do want to make cycling more of a recreational activity, the Briscycle website recommends "picking a section close to home and making a day out of that."

"There are plenty of landmarks, little shops to grab lunch, and rail connections to get you

back home," the website says.

n providing more than just fabulous entertainment over the last 15 years, Redcliffe Musical Theatre (RMT) has been a cornerstone of the local arts scene and a source of inspiration and support for so many.

argate local Barry Tuton's life before moving to the Peninsula in 1977 was to say the least, a colourful one. He left home and school aged 15 and moved into Brisbane City, becoming as he calls it, `one of Brisbane's original street kids`. He subsequently worked in a variety of jobs involved with the Meatworkers, Storeman and Packers and the Painters and Dockers unions.

Finding it cheaper and bringing him closer to the North Coast and his favourite sport, surfing, he moved to Redcliffe, where he worked for a time on a local trawler. Living at Filmer's Palace Hotel, provided by the late iconic Mavis Filmer, he soon immersed himself in environmental matters and in 1998, he joined and became a Vice President of the then newly formed Redcliffe Dugongs group based at the Palace Hotel. The group was dedicated to protecting Moreton Bay's endangered dugong herd from a proposed fish farming venture in Moreton Bay. Currently he is Chairman of the Mavis Filmer Award, which arose from that group. The award is given to local individuals, who contribute significantly to the wellbeing of local wildlife.

His love of photography and visual art allowed him to attend local art classes and create images that were subsequently published regularly in the local newspaper. He had a local Rotary club calendar dedicated to his work and he provided photographs to local politicians for their Christmas greetings cards. History, always of interest to him, saw him join and become



active in The Gayundah Preservation Society, a local group battling unsuccessfully, to save the wreck of an historic Australian warship beached at Woody Point.

Acting in movies was his next venture. He was selected as the performing narrator Bertie Banksia, for all three locally produced historic mockumentary movies. Showing his acting versatility he also played four other parts in these movies, as well. Covid brought about an amusing offer to the now well-known local actor. An online spoof local newspaper named the Redcliffe Rave invited him to become their Home Affairs reporter in which he wrote about a make believe group dedicated to creating Redcliffe as a breakaway country from Australia. "My latter years have been fun!" he said.



GOOD MENTAL HEALTH

Supporting Someone's Mental Health

ctober is mental health month and sometimes talking about mental health can be uncomfortable, especially when someone is struggling. Here is a quick guide on how to support someone's mental health distress.

Firstly, ACT. Don't be afraid - you won't catch it! If you notice someone is struggling, ask them how they are doing.

Then, listen – without judgment. Sometimes, all a person needs is someone to listen. Avoid offering solutions right away and instead, validate their feelings. Phrases like, "I get this must be difficult for you" or "I'm here to support you" can go a long way.

Action: Once you have heard them, talk to them about who or what might be of help. Ask them what could help and if you could support them. It might be talking to the boss about a bully or accessing a professional through their work's employee assistance programs.

Remember, you do not have to have all the answers, but you can guide them to who does.

Lastly, follow up. After a few days, find a quiet spot and check in with the person. How are they doing? They might not have taken action yet, but that is not the point. It is about them knowing you are there and wanting to support them.

By supporting people in this way, we can make a difficult situation better for others while creating a better environment for everyone.

On a side note: While supporting others, make sure you stay okay. Supporting people can take its toll, so practice good self-care.





new ones paint a sad picture of lack of support. So that you, the reader, can appreciate this sad picture, I am listing a few examples of how far some Redcliffe arts and crafters go to keep our community entertained from their own pockets.

Choral singers each pay over \$300 per year to retain a conductor and accompanist. That's before they pay for the hall hire.

A couple with children have sold their home and now rent, so they could afford to hire a hall, which they have named The Loft Gallery and Coffee House. This venue provides a performing facility for community concerts and exhibitions.

A crafts group has paid \$1000 to hire a hall to exhibit their locally-made pottery.

A performing musical and drama acting group, despite mounting debts, continues to pay high rent for a hall to train local performers.

An iconic dance company, which for the last 20 odd years have hosted an annual national dance competition that attracts more than 2000 adult and child dancers, has been denied a local funding grant to cover operating costs.

A qualified and award-winning art teacher earns less than the annual pension because she chooses to devote her life to giving both local adult and young artists a chance of becoming competent artists in the future.

Please support your local arts and crafts groups by attending their concerts, exhibitions and events and request your council and local businesses to further lend their support as well.
